Not long to go before you can all have a well-deserved break. We have now sent out around 90% of all 1st instalments of our 2018/19 Pupil Premium Plus for our children in care. We have recorded increased referrals to all our services, including Beanstalk, Private Tuition, CAMHS Counselling, Education Psychology, Careers Advice, Play Therapy and Life Story Therapy. You will all receive a copy of LACES Annual Performance report, for the 2017/18 academic year in September 2018, which will provide details of our service delivery and impact of our support and interventions.

We had our OFSTED inspection during May 2018, this was part of the local authority inspection of children and young people's services. The authority was judged as Requiring Improvement. A copy of the report can be found on the OFSTED website.

I would like to thank all our Designated LAC Teachers and staff in your respective schools for the most amazing support you provide to the city's most vulnerable children. We fully appreciate the challenges you face, whilst your commitment to care and support our children is a credit to each and every one of you.

### **Updated guidance for Designated Teachers**

Following detailed consultation, the Department of Education have revised the statutory guidance for Designated Teachers and Virtual School Heads. The key changes are:

- New duties to provide advice and guidance to Post-care children i.e. Adopted, Special-Guardianship and Child Arrangement Order
- DTs should contribute to whole school policies and procedures
- Schools should be supportive of in-year transfers of CLA between schools
- Preparation for adulthood, offering guidance and financial information where required

# **Personal Education Plans (PEPS)**

It is a statutory requirement that all looked after children have a PEP as part of their overall care plan, and these must be updated every six months.

This term we continue to receive many excellent PEPs that clearly demonstrate how well schools know their children in care pupils and how you are supporting their learning.

### **Pupil Premium Plus for CLA**

For the first time in three years the Pupil Premium Plus for looked after and post care children has been increased. Allocation's will continue to be made in two instalments of £1,000 and £1,200, these payments will be made to schools in June/July 2018 and October/November 2018 respectively.

## Message from Kinship Carers Liverpool.....

Kinship Carers Liverpool is a grass roots project based in the Ellergreen Community Centre, working with kinship families right across Liverpool. *Kinship families are children who are being raised by another family member or friend,* this is often due to parent's mental health, substance misuse or bereavement. This group of children often have the same support issues as the Looked After population, but often go unrecognised or supported.

Our project offers a variety of support to the whole family, the main benefits being the peer support that the families get from coming along to our project, and the realisation that they are not the only ones in this situation. We offer emotional support to carers through our open-door policy of always being here to listen, we signpost families for advice on legal matters, we attend meetings in schools and with CAHMS and we work 1-1 with children who are displaying emotional issues.

We deliver inter-generational family sessions with the family coming together for food and fun activities; we provide a variety of days out for the children over the school holidays including residentials, which also give the carers some much needed respite. We hold coffee mornings every Wednesday at the Ellergreen Centre and we have satellite bases in Netherley and Huyton, for carers who can't get to Ellergreen. We run a pamper day on the first Friday of every month at Ellergreen, where carers can chat with people in similar positions as themselves, they can access massage, a facial or get their nails painted, have their eyebrows and eyelashes waxed and tinted!

Whatever reason Kinship Carers want to access our service is fine by us, we are here to try and make their lives that little bit easier, by supporting them especially when times are hard.
